Bean is the most personal story I have written. I wrote this script to better understand my father but much more than that, I want to tell an immigrant story about the uncomfortable in-betweeness that is felt when you move to a new country. Vika is in transition from child to teenager - from Russian to American and this film deals the struggles with such changes. Growing up I was told I was too American at home and called Russian at school, both identities isolated me. I want this film to represent many immigrant families and introduce generational and identity issues that arise when you have to call a new place "home."

This story is a sort of memory, so sounds and music play a big role. The film is full of sounds and music which help portray Vika's feelings.

She pays close attention to the psychology of every character, crafting a story that is experiential, personal and authentic.
