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## 1. Logline

At the end of a dinner with friends at a Chinese Restaurant, a young man becomes immobilized as he reads in his fortune cookie that today is his last day on Earth, which changes his life and raises the question of what life means.

### 2. Synopsis

As Joe and his five friends have just enjoyed their meal at a Chinese restaurant in Lower Manhattan, he opens up his fortune cookie and discovers a message that shocks him into a stupor. Taking the message at face value, he challenges his friends to tell them what they would do if today were their last day. This leads the group to discuss the meaning of life. While his BFF, Tom, tries to reassure him in every way, the other friends explain their various views, which correspond strikingly to their characters. Karim, influenced by existentialism and Albert Camus's idea of the absurd, encourages Joe to embrace death instead of seeing it is as a bad thing. Maya, a believer in reincarnation, expounds upon the cyclic nature of life and death. Rachel, a strong believer in God, urges Joe to be reconciled with God, arguing that infinite regress in the universe is impossible and that there must be a "last stop." Amidst sceptic interjections by Karim, she concludes with the Pascalian argument that if she's wrong, life is merely without purpose, but if she's right, coming to terms with God is essential. Bert, a hedonist, believes Joe should "live it up" and enjoy and consume every bit of life, especially food. Lastly, Tom expresses scepticism that Joe can know the future and tells him to just keep doing whatever he's doing now. Against this backdrop of competing viewpoints. Joe also witnesses his friends become blinded to his predicament and seem more concerned about how an unexpected positive turn in his fortune will positively affect them. He becomes immobilized in terms of deciding how he's going to face the end his of life. Can a lotto jackpot offer any consolation in the face of death? Can Joe enjoy the luxurious life of a millionaire if he has no more nights, no more days, and he leaves the world today? The force of everything he has just witnessed culminates in the few simple words that finally emanate from his mouth.

#### 3. Director's Statement

Conspiracy theorists might debate whether Neil Armstrong really landed on the moon or not, but we can agree that our birth and death are certain. Nobody knows exactly when, how and what's going to happen after we kick it. What if I somehow come to know that "this is it—that kick off day happens to be today" and I have no more days and nights to breathe in this world! Will my kids be happy and safe? Will my lovely wife bring flowers to my grave? Will I still have a plate at the brunch or dinner? Will I still have my spot on the couch? Will Starbucks coffee remain warm in my favorite mug? Will my buddies still expect and wait for me at the Chinese buffet? Am I gone forever? Or just on a trip across the river? Will we meet in heaven or some other world? Not sure, since I never died before! Some of these questions become metaphors in the surreal drama of the short film "Message in the Fortune Cookie," which raises questions that all human beings might ask before leaving the world.

The journey of this project commenced a few years back when my childhood best friend, Mustafa Kamal Chowdhury, took off from the world at the age of 43 of a sudden brain stroke, orphaning his two adorable kids, widowing his sweet wife, and breaking all left behinds' hearts, like mine. He inspired me to study filming as well as performing in drama and theater. As a tribute to my friend, I started the initial dramatic storyline of "Message in the Fortune Cookie" which was crafted into cinematic embroidery afterwards by dexterous hands across the globe. More than three years' days and nights of dedication by talented composers from New York to Utah, vocalists from Toronto to Miami, animation & VFX studios from Indonesia, Bangladesh, India, Toronto, and most of all, the brilliant actors, actresses and crews from across Canada and USA are reflected and projected on the screen for just 19 minutes. Mountains of research, prototypes, tool developments, and unwavering efforts have culminated in the realization of this film. I can't even express enough through words my feelings about the close collaboration and collective effort that went into this project.

It was my remarkable experience and great privilege writing the lyrics and spotting notes along with my talented composers and working online with a virtual team of gifted vocalists around the globe on a daily basis.

Good filmmaking does not consist of rules written in stone; rather it's an art which ought to be boundless, as demonstrated throughout the filmmaking history by building the rule, setting the benchmark, and also breaking the conventional rules. In this project, we experimented outside of the box and intentionally crossed so many traditional lines to establish some new perspectives of filmmaking. I'm confident that these endeavors will be successful once the project catches to the attention of viewers!

Golam Mustofa, born in Dhaka, Bangladesh and educated in the USA, is the director, writer, editor, and producer of the "Message in the Fortune Cookie." In addition, he has been a well-known actor in stage shows and popular Bengali folk theatre.

Mustofa earned a B.S. in Accounting and an M.S. in Computer Science from the City University NY (CUNY), where he also studied Visual Communication Media, Computer Graphics, Indie Film Making, Photography, Computer Animation, and Computer Music, and made numbers of short films. He is also skilled in Screenwriting, Song writing, 3D Animation, Graphic Design, Sound Mixing,

conditions, Yasar ensured that these natural factors did not affect the look of the movie.

Jonathan Rabson participated in "Message in the Fortune Cookie" primarily as co-writer and composer. As a writer, he helped shape a new kind of story, in which positions are expounded upon by different characters, but the audience is left to decide the final meaning and truth. As a composer, he has sought to clarify the drama, move it forward, and help realize Golam Mustofa's vision of a highly musical, almost operatic approach to filmmaking.

Mr. Rabson is a composer and writer in the greater New York City area. He has written music for several independent films, employing a wide range of musical styles, including classical, pop, jazz, and ethnic music. He has also composed hundreds of pieces for piano, orchestra, voice, and various solo instrument and chamber music combinations. Mr. Rabson has been composing since the age of 7. He was the recipient of a number of awards as a student, including a BMI Student Composer Award at the age of 15. His teachers included Pulitzer Prize recipients William Bolcom and Leslie Bassett at the University of Michigan, where he earned a Bachelors and Master's

degree in composition. His music has been frequently used by the Christian dance group Pointes of Faith. A pianist and skilled improviser, some of Mr. Rabson's most evocative works came to life as improvisations that he plays for his wife as she's going to sleep.

As an author, Mr. Rabson has co-written film scripts as well as numerous articles about software development and business innovation. In addition to his roles as co-writer and composer for "Message in the Fortune Cookie," he also served as audition supervisor, as well as making cameo appearances on-screen.


Michael Pearson – as "Joe"
